8/4 That we may all see ourselves as stewards of an inheritance, to share those gifts now, and to make plans so they benefit others after we pass from this earth

8/11 That we may be inspired by Abraham's example of faith and be compassionate to those who leave their homeland to follow God's call.

8/11 That we may recognize our roles as temporary stewards, living a short life and expected to do much with the considerable gifts we have been given.
